## 4<sup>TH</sup> GRADE CAMP GUIDELINES

1. All 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Camp classes are held in the 4700 building on the San Luis Obispo Cuesta College Campus.
2. Parents should plan to bring students no earlier than 5 minutes prior to the start of class.
3. Instructors are responsible for supervising the students during class. Students are expected to behave in a non-disruptive manner during and after class. At all times students should remember that they are *guests* on a college campus.
4. If your student will be absent please call 546-3132 and leave student's name and the date(s) of absence.
5. Please leave bicycles, skateboards, inline skates, scooters, and any other human powered mechanical transportation devices at home as they are not allowed on campus.
6. Only registered students are allowed in the classes. Student guests may not attend.
7. Students must wear shoes on campus.
8. Students are responsible for their own belongings. Consider sending your student with a backpack and a water bottle.
9. Students who are severely allergic to bee stings should carry a bee sting kit.
10. Health problems occurring during 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Camp should be reported immediately to the Community Programs Office. Parents will be contacted and therefore **it is essential that we have your current daytime and emergency telephone numbers.**
11. For serious illnesses or injuries, the campus Public Safety Office and Health Center will be notified. Emergency First Aid care will be given and, if necessary, transportation via ambulance to Sierra Vista Hospital will be made.
12. Cuesta College is an open campus. The Public Safety Office has an on-duty police officer to respond to all reported acts of criminal activity. They may be reached at 546-3205, and are located in Building 6600 near Parking Lot 3.
