Viewers follow Jung's life from his childhood through his years as a hospital psychiatrist, to the initial influence of Freud and their disagreement and split. Former pupils reveal Jung's impact on their lives.

Inheritance of Dreams

Focuses on Jung's conception of archetypes—the stories and symbols that are shared by different cultures and that make up the collective unconscious. Analyst John Beebe identifies archetypes in science fiction films such as Star Wars. Rare footage traces Jung's travels to Africa, Britain and New Mexico.

Searching for Soul with Bobbe Tyler

Carl Jung said we can either live consciously in control of our destiny, or suffer our fate at the whims of our unconscious. *Searching for Soul: A Survivor's Guide* by Bobbe Tyler tells of her lifelong journey of coming to consciousness by responding to a set of questions about human psychic development (included in her book) from research entitled *The Harvesting Wisdom Interview*. Copies of the questions will be handed out for participatory discussion from the group, and the author will read passages from Chapter Ten in the book to further enhance group discussion and a Q&A session at the close of her presentation. (Note: Reading some of the book beforehand is desirable for a deeper understanding of how the consciousness process relates to the questions, but not obligatory.)
